
The overall goal of **UANITED** is to empower internally displaced persons (IDPs) through open innovation initiatives that promote youth engagement and resilience in times of crisis.

# **During the event:**

- Panel discussion featured insights from invited experts on the event's key topics;
- Participants generated their own vision of the urgent needs of internally displaced youth during the war, focusing on psychological recovery, the development of educational needs and businesses, and the role of art in social integration;
- Conducted a mapping of needs and launched the co-design planning process aimed at developing solutions to support youth life in Ukraine today through open innovation;
- Laid the groundwork for future thematic meetings within the project.
